Service Contract Maintenance Requirements Drip Distribution

Lake County General Health District requires the following services be performed on your septic system a minimum of once per year to ensure your system is adequately treating waste water.

- 1. Comply with the drip assurance approval and maintenance guide lines.
- 2. Check sludge levels in tank and pump tanks when needed.
- 3. Clean effluent filters in tank and disc filters in hydraulic unit.
- 4. Check all alarms, heater and control panel to see if functional.
- 5. Check all pump and hydraulic unit.
- 6. Check for ponding or erosion along tubing.
- 7. Check air release valves.
- 8. Check dosing flow rates and flushing flow rates and adjust accordingly.
- 9. Check curtain/interceptor drains are clear of debris and effluent.

Lake County General Health District does not provide these services. Please contract with a licensed service provider to provide these services. All inspections done by Lake County General Health District are ONLY to verify there is no public health nuisance present and the system was functioning as designed at time of inspection.

Frequency of Service: Once every year

Permit Term: 1 year

Permit Renewal Fee: \$40.00

All homes that are not connected to sanitary sewers must have a household sewage treatment system (HSTS). The HSTS collects all the wastewater from the home and treats it through various methods before returning the water to the environment. Lake County General Health District requires that these HSTS be functioning. If they are creating a public health nuisance as defined in the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 3701-29 of the Sewage Treatment System Rules, homeowner must repair or replace system.
